


Distinguished Graduate Honored At Catholic Schools Week Mass





St. Martin of Tours School recently celebrated National Catholic Schools Week (CSW). This special week was established in 1974, to recognize Catholic Education as a great gift to the Church and the nation and to celebrate Communities of *Faith, Knowledge and Service*. Each year, during CSW, we honor one of our alumni. This year, **Mary Jo Martin** was named our 2018 Distinguished Graduate. Mary Jo has been associated with St. Martin of Tours since an early age. Mary Jo was baptized here at St. Martin and graduated from our grade school in 1957. At the age of 19, Mary Jo began her teaching career here at St. Martin School and continued to do so for the next 40 years becoming one of our most beloved faculty members.

TASK FORCE REPORTS

Parish Life: Children's Halloween Fellowship- was held on October 28, 2017. The children attended the 5:00 p.m. Mass in costume, and paraded afterwards to the Parish Center, led by Father Terry. Pizza and pop were served, and there were several games for the children to enjoy. We had a very nice crowd of children and parents. All Souls Vesper Service and Reception- was held on October 29, 2017. After the service, some light appetizers were served for those in attendance. This was an opportunity for family members of the deceased to relax with friends and relatives, and begin the healing of their hearts in light of the passing of a loved one during the past 12 months. Advent Wreath Making- The weekend of December 2 & 3 was the first Sunday of Advent. After all the Sunday Masses, a fellowship was held in Father Mick Hall, where parishioners were able to make wreaths for their home for the Advent season. All the supplies needed (fresh greens. candles, and wire forms) were supplied. Doughnuts, coffee, milk and juice were available while parishioners made their wreaths. Fr. Terry suggested the idea of having a station to make Advent wreaths as an activity at the next Day with Santa. DRE, Laurie Huff will contact our PTO to look into the possibility of making that happen.

Upcoming Events: Our annual Wedding Anniversary Celebration- will occur on Sunday, February 11, 2018. This fellowship is held for couples who have been married 25, 30, 40, 50, and 60+ years in the calendar year of 2018. At the 9:30 Mass, Father will bless the couples and acknowledge them for their commitment to the Sacrament of Marriage. A breakfast will follow in Father Mick Hall. Holy Saturday Night- is March 31, 2018. This is the evening of the Easter Vigil at which New Catholics are welcomed into the Catholic Community. Following this Mass which includes Baptisms, First Eucharist and Confirmations, a reception with light appetizers will be held in Father Mick Hall to celebrate this joyous occasion. Easter Sunday- is on April 1, 2018. We will hold our annual Easter Egg Hunt, following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. This is always a fun event for children and adults alike!

Spiritual Life: Stations of the Nativity presented by Adult Faith Formation (AFF) in December went very well and were very well received by the attendees. AFF will also present Social Justice Stations of the Cross on one of the Friday evenings in Lent. We are in the very early planning stages of a Parish Mission, possibly this coming fall or next spring with a theme of "Caring for Creation." The book group postponed their discussion of *A Christmas Carol* until January 23, 2018.

Finance: Fr. Terry expressed his gratitude to our generous parishioners for the contributions made to the parish at Christmastime. CMA kickoff is on January 20 & 21, 2018. We continue to benefit from pledges to the "One Faith, One Hope, One Love" campaign. We receive our parish percentage of all payments made to the campaign twice each year. This money is put into our "Preserving Our Treasures Fund."

Youth: Lenten Fish Frys- will be held each Friday in Lent (except Good Friday) on the St. Martin campus. Gina Rider will write an article for Tour Talk highlighting our Scouts and some of their accomplishments. There is an all-Scout ski outing at Perfect North Slopes scheduled for January.

Athletics: Maroon Out- has been rescheduled. The Athletics Mass- held on January 14, 2018, was a prayerful gathering of players, coaches and families. Girls volleyball ended their season and held their banquet where eighth graders were recognized with a presentation. Boys basketball is in mid-season; Third grade Tournament will be held the first three weeks of February. Girls basketball season begins February 2, 2018; the Westside Classic Tournament, co-hosted with St. Lawrence will run March 10-25, 2018. Grade 1&2 boys/girls basketball finishes up the first weekend of February. Boys baseball and girls softball sign-ups are in full swing.

Liturgical Ministry: RCIA- Our next big step will be the Rite of Sending on Saturday, February 17, 2018, here at St. Martin. This leads to the Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion at St. Peter in Chains Cathedral on February 18, 2018. Worship- All of the services during Advent and the Christmas Season were beautiful. There were many compliments

on the beauty of our church, the music and the homilies during the many Masses and the Reconciliation and Vespers Services. Next Worship meeting is in February.

Outreach: St. Vincent de Paul served more than 85 families for Christmas, some were regular SVdP families and others were families from our school, who were identified by our Principal, Mr. Fightmaster. They held their pick-up day on December 23, 2017.

Property & Grounds: Fr. Terry reported that repair work on the stained glass window in the choir loft is underway. The pipes from the Great Division of the Wicks Organ have been removed and carefully stored, the scaffolding has been erected, and sections of the stained glass window will be removed and taken to be repaired. Fr. Terry again expressed his gratitude for the generosity of our parishioners who donate to our "Preserving Our Treasures Fund," which makes regular upkeep and repair work possible. The very cold weather has kept the boilers working hard and the maintenance crew working hard to keep them running smoothly. Some of the boilers are original to the 1950s section of the yellow school building and require special handling and care.

Education Commission: No report

Principal: School Open House- will be held Sunday, January 21, 2018. Catholic School's Week begins Sunday, January 28, 2018. There will be special activities all week for the students and staff of our school.

Martinfest-Our first annual Martinfest event that took place on Saturday, November 11, 2017, was a fruitful success thanks to the St. Martin of Tours Parish family! In the early planning stage is the second annual Martinfest scheduled for Saturday, November 10, 2018. Thanksgiving Day Mass-The gathering on Thanksgiving Day was bountiful with many families present for the celebration. A special food collection for St. Vincent de Paul was brought to the altar. In addition, an array of parish members from the young to the seasoned assisted with "setting the table" by placing the tablecloth and carrying the wheat, bread, grapes and wine in procession. Feast of St. Nicholas-During the first week of Advent, in honor of his feast day, December 6, 2017, St. Martin of Tours was blessed with the presence of St. Nicholas, the "Wonder Worker!" While he was here, he made a special visit to all of the classrooms at our parish school with delicious candy canes in tow! First Reconciliation - Congratulations to our youth who celebrated the Lord's mercy and forgiveness for the first time in the Sacrament of Reconciliation on December 12, 2017. There were a total of twenty-one candidates - nine of which were baptized last summer and fall. A gracious thank-you to Parish Life for the special reception that followed! Giving Tree-Due to the generosity of the St. Martin of Tours family, the giving tree touched many lives this Christmas Season including Healthy Moms and Babes, Santa Maria, St. Vincent de Paul as well as our nursing home and homebound parishioners. Students from St. Martin of Tours School touched many of our recipients of the giving tree with their greeting cards of love and goodness. One particular woman shared that she loved her Christmas card so much that she had it framed! Nativity Story- Near the later part of November, as the harvest air defined by the bounty of decorated pumpkins, falling leaves and the Thanksgiving cornucopia begin its transition, the gentle whisper of Advent waiting takes shape. Within it, much excitement and anticipation dances with thoughts of our youth accepting the invitation to participate in the "Nativity Story" at our Christmas Eve Masses. World Marriage Day- We will honor couples celebrating a special wedding anniversary this year of 25, 30, 40, 50, 60 or more years of marriage on February 11, 2018. Ash Wednesday-On February 14, 2018, Lent officially begins! The Light is On for You-All parishes in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati will be offering the faithful to encounter the peace of Christ in the Sacrament of Reconciliation from 7:00 – 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 27, 2018.

Why Do Catholics Do That?

Easter Vigil

The Easter Vigil is the most important Mass of the year. In the complete ranking of all Catholic Church celebrations, the Triduum occupies the top spot. The Triduum, which begins with Holy Thursday's Mass of the Lord's Supper, concludes on Easter, reaching its climax with the Easter Vigil. If there is one Mass in which Catholics should make every effort to participate every year, it is the Easter Vigil. If you attend church Easter Sunday morning but miss the Easter Vigil, you have missed the most important celebration of the year.

The Easter Vigil celebrates the Resurrection of Christ and the commitment of believers. It has four parts. It begins with a service of light. The community gathers in darkness to hear that Christ is our light, shattering the darkness of sin. The next part of the Vigil is the Liturgy of the Word. We hear up to nine Scripture passages that tell the story of salvation, ending with the Gospel of the resurrection.

The third part is the liturgy of baptism. Some catechumens have already been listed among the elect, those chosen for baptism this year. They now come forward to be plunged into the waters of new birth. Anointed with chrism, they celebrate confirmation, receiving the strength of God's Spirit for the Christian life. Then the entire community renews its baptismal promises. Together we pledge our faith in the resurrection and promise to follow Christ more closely.

The Vigil culminates in the fourth part, the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The length of the celebration has sharpened our hunger for communion. Now the newly baptized will join us in the Eucharist for the very first time. At the Easter Vigil we recommit ourselves to our faith and rejoice with the newly baptized.
