Alumni Correspondence



Peggy Loar

Peggy (Wahl) Loar (Class of 1962) sent in an email to thank her alma mater for keeping her connected with her alumni newsletter and included an update on herself. Peggy is a museum professional with global experience in museum planning and program development, museum architecture and design, and museum leadership. She currently serves as President of International Museum Planning Consultants, a boutique advisory services firm. Prior to this role, she was

the interim Vice President for Global Arts and Culture and Director of the Asia Society Museum in New York City (2014–2015) and the interim President and Director of the Corcoran Gallery of Art and College of Art & Design in Washington, D.C. where she facilitated the merger of the Corcoran with the National Gallery of Art and George Washington University (2013–2014). From 2008 to 2013 she served as the founding Director of the new National Museum of Qatar, in Doha, designed by Jean Nouvel, where she brought 30 years of experience in museum planning and management, exhibition design and educational programming to the Qatar Museums Authority. Prior to this, she served as Director of the Museum Studio at Voorsanger Architects P.C. in New York City. She is the founding President and Director of two American institutions, The Wolfsonian Museum and Research Center in Miami, Florida, and Genoa, Italy; and COPIA: The American Center for Wine, Food and the Arts in Napa, California, where she was later named President Emerita.

Prior to these positions, Ms. Loar was Director of the Smithsonian Institution's Traveling Exhibition Service (SITES) for 9 years where she developed the program to over 100 exhibitions for annual circulation nationally and internationally. She was awarded the Smithsonian Gold Medal for Distinguished Service, previously given to only eight individuals in the history of the Institution. Ms. Loar also served as the first Program Director of the Institute of Museum Services (now IMLS) – the Federal funding agency for American museums, and as Curator of Education and Assistant Director of the Indianapolis Museum of Art. For eight years she served as President of US ICOM (International Committee of Museums) headquartered with UNESCO in Paris, where she received recognition for her outstanding leadership and invaluable service to the international museum profession. She holds B.A. and M.A. degrees from the University of Cincinnati, and an Arts Leadership Certificate from Stanford University Graduate School of Business.

Charlie Norman (Class of 1992) always reads his Alumni newsletter with great interest. He says that it's always fun to see how former classmates and friends are doing. With that in mind, he wanted to pass on an update on himself. In January of this year he was appointed by the Governor of Ohio to serve as the State of Ohio's 31st Registrar of Motor Vehicles. Charlie has

a staff of approximately 700 individuals and oversees 186 Deputy Registrars and their nearly 1,800 employees throughout the State. When sworn in this past February, Charlie became the youngest Registrar in Ohio history!

This appointment required that he move from his beloved west side to the state capital. Charlie's wife and children were able to join him a few months later, and they have settled down in Columbus. He is very appreciative of SMOT Alumni Association keeping people connected.
